BIRDING THE CLOUD FORESTS OF ECUADOR



On March 3, 2020, Jim and Mitzie Wittliff began a trip into the high-elevation cloud forests of Ecuador. Their trip, coordinated by an Ecuadoran veterinarian-turned conservationist/eco-lodge developer, would take them to five different remote locations in the Andean forests. With the help of indigenous guides, the Wittliffs observed more than 100 species of birds. Due to the lack of radio or TV, poor wireless service, and local staff who spoke little or no English, they emerged from the forest unaware that the world had changed in those few days due to the arrival of the COVID-19 virus. Join us on February 14 as they share their story and their photographs.

PAST FIELD TRIPS

Reformatory Lake, January 18 - Cloudy skies, calm wind with temps in the low 30s. Eleven hardy birders met at Reformatory Lake on a raw January morning. No ducks or other waterfowl were on the lake when we arrived, but we were rewarded with a large flock (approximately 55) of Greater White-fronted Geese that flew in shortly after we

arrived and joined a large group of Canada Geese foraging in the field across the lake. We managed to get a few more birds before moving to Wendell Moore Park. Ten birders continued on from Reformatory Lake to Wendell Moore Park. The birding was slow and quiet, but we did get Sandhill Cranes flying over at the end of our walk. Even they were quiet; we saw them but never heard them!



ANOTHER RARE BIRD

Another rare bird showed up to start 2023 off with a bang and to continue our rare bird sightings. A Western Tanager started coming to a feeder in the St. Regis park area just before Christmas. The home owners, Rick and Jamella Sullivan, graciously invited birders to come and see the tanager. Many local and state birders have taken the opportunity to see this beautiful bird. This is the second Western Tanager to appear in

Louisville in recent years. The last one was in December 2019. Thanks to Steve Brown for his picture of the Western Tanager. There are many wonderful pictures of the Western Tanager on ebird. Hope you check them out.
